I join you in celebrating the Golden Jubilee of the Cooperative Republic of Guyana. I ask you to join with me in heralding a new era of peace, prosperity and progress.



Outstanding Achievement Award - Non-Profit Organization

This award recognizes excellence and innovation among non-profit organizations resulting in significant social impact and whose achievements are met through the application of creative and practical approaches to benefit the community in general with an emphasis on underserved populations.



Giving Help To Kids' (GHTK) is a registered Guyanese Canadian Charitable Organization with a mission to decrease the neonatal and infant mortality rates in developing countries, starting with Guyana. Over the years, the organization has been able to effectively sustain change by focusing on comprehensive education of healthcare professionals and assist their efforts to save lives with specialized equipment and ongoing training. GHTK is an organization that is comprised of dedicated and compassionate individuals who form the Board of Directors and their motto is "Every child deserves a life". Since the inception of GHTK, infant mortality rate in Guyana has been reduced by 40%.

The initial work of GHTK was focused at the Georgetown Public Hospital Corporation (GPHC) with the opening of a new neonatal intensive care unit (ICU) but has further expanded to five other hospitals in Guyana. It is important to note that more than ninety-five (95) percent of funds raised are used for educational programs and equipment purchases for GHTK's work.

As a result of their resounding success in Guyana, the Board decided to expand their outreach to other Caribbean countries. In view of this expansion, the official name of Guyana Help the Kids was changed to Giving Health to Kids.

Canada Guyana Outreach Mission (CanGo) Outstanding Achievement Award Non-Profit Organization

The Canada Guyana Outreach Mission (CanGo) is a non-profit organization dedicated to promoting health care in Guyana through confidential, compassionate and supportive medical services to the general public with emphasis on the remote parts of Guyana. CanGo have been visiting Guyana annually since 2014 with particular focus on the remote regions where access to healthcare is a challenge.

The CanGo team is made up of dedicated health care professionals from Canada, the United States of America and Guyana. They have formed partnerships with various organizations which have mutual interests such as the Toronto Kaieteur Lion's Club, the Guyana Medical Council based in California USA, The Ministry of Public Health in Guyana, the Education Relief Organization (H.E.R.O) based in New York, USA, Health Partners International of Canada, Project DAWN in Guyana and the Georgetown Public Hospital.

The team has a long-standing relationship with the Ptolemy Reid Centre where they provide training to staff, with a focus on persons with disabilities and mental health; and collaborating with the Berbice Psychiatric Hospital.

The team's work also extends to the provision of cleft lip and/or palate corrective surgeries for persons from remote communities, where access to corrective surgeries is severely challenged due to remoteness and limitation of resources.





Tosh Jeffrey is an Artist born in Guyana, who migrated to the USA, then to Canada, where he obtained a BA in Visual Art and a BA in Art History from the University of Western Ontario. He went onto Teacher's College in Australia where he attained a Graduate Diploma in Education.

Jeffrey believes that his life story shaped his perspective and informs his art. An artist who advocates that Guyana is part of him and through his art; people can experience a part of his Guyanese heritage. Jeffrey's art work has been displayed at a number of art shows and galleries including the Art Square Gallery, Junction Summer Solstice Festival, The Art Tour, Gallery 1313, Dundas West Artist Market, among others.

Jeffrey is a YWCA contributor and Community Artist for the Child and Youth Advocacy Centre in Toronto, Part of the Arts Outreach Society, among others. He was also Landscape Artist of the year finalist and was featured on CBC TV show called "Our Toronto" and on Toronto.com. He is also a Ghana School of Dreams contributor.



Business Excellence & Leadership Demerara Distillers Limited (DDL)

DDL, commonly known for its El Dorado brand, has a rich history. Originally created on the banks of the Demerara river, their smooth and uniquely complex El Dorado aged rums, represent over 300 years of Caribbean crafting. The brand has grown tremendously and has gained notoriety around the world and has become the national pride of Guyanese.

DDL's commitment to the Guyanese community in Canada is very visible and commendable. Over the years, the El Dorado brand has supported many Guyanese community events including major events hosted by the Caribbean Northern Charities, Giving Health to Kids, Guyana Ex-Soldiers Association of Canada, Last Lap Lime, Guyana Independence Festival, the Alliance of Guyanese Canadian Organizations and The Guyana Ex-Police Association of Canada, among others The El Dorado brand received the Gold Award at the International Rum Festival in Canada in 2003 as well as the award for Best Rum Worldwide at the International Wine and Spirits Competition in the UK for a number of consecutive years. They were also mentioned for the highest scoring rum ever to be tasted by the Beverage Tasting Institute in Chicago.

Additionally, DDL is recognised for its contributions to society under its Corporate Social Responsibilities towards charitable causes and its work in collaboration with the Doobay Medical and Research Centre.



In 1979, Anthony Subryan became involved in the rigid plastic food packaging industry and his travels took him constantly across the North American continent where he earned the reputation as an innovator. In 1994, he started out on his own specializing in the dairy industry, manufacturing machines to package products such as cottage cheese, sour cream, yogurt, ice cream, ricotta, margarine, juices, sauces, dips and an endless list of plastic containers used in food packaging.

Today the company has grown and expanded and ships its products all across Canada, USA, Caribbean and many other parts of the world. The packaging machine used by Banks DIH in Guyana for its ice cream was manufactured by ATS Engineering Inc. ATS's machines exceed USDA, FDA and 3A Dairy Standards.

ATS has been in business for over 25 years and Anthony Subryan is recognized in the Industry as a "Master Builder", who has mastered the art of redesigning and modifying dairy equipment, mostly filling machines for processors that needed to achieve higher speeds and efficiencies. ATS Engineering Inc. is recognized as one of the undisputed leaders in the dairy industry in Canada for its innovative work.





Pamela Maynard was born in Guyana, attended Fountain AME and was the daughter of Guyanese born singer/songwriter Mavis Maynard; who wrote Pamela's debut hit Lost, Lonely and Helpless. She is described as a versatile artiste performing such genres of music like Gospel, Reggae, Soul, R&B, Jazz, Calypso and Soca.

Maynard made history in the film industry by receiving awards in four (4) genres of music including Best Reggae, Country and Western, Soul and R&B from SurfNoir Inc in the USA. In the UK she received the prestigious JetStar Award, the Music Volks Award in Germany and the Reggae Award, best Calypso and best Gospel Awards in Canada, among others.

The list of artists she has shared the stage with included legends such Ben E. King, the Platters, the Drifters and Ray Charles; top Jamaican artistes such as Jimmy Cliff, Hopeton Lewis, John Holt, Byron Lee & The Dragonaires and Boris Gardner; and other artistes such as Sid and the Slickers, Yoruba Singers, Aubrey Mann, Smallman Band as well as calypsonian giants Lord Kitchener, the Mighty Sparrow, Shadow, Baron, Troubadours among others.

Pamela Maynard passed away in 2012 and her daughter, Mrs. Sonja Maynard-Knights will accept the award in memory of her mother.



Leadership in Volunteerism & Community Service

This award is presented to persons who have made significant contributions to their community through their time, actions, talents and dedication (outside any volunteer work done for their employer). Awardees have shown consistent and sustained commitment and professionalism to community projects and have consistently applied leadership skills over an extended period of time.



Joe Jaglall is a committed devotee to volunteerism and charity around the world. He is a role model to many. He is well respected amongst his peers and dedicates his time to persons in need. He respects and creates good humor and as a leader, he demonstrates the importance of humanitarianism and selfless service.

Over the many years, Jaglall has partnered with many organizations to raise funds for the needy and vulnerable members of the community. Some of the organizations and causes that have benefited tremendously from his voluntary services are the Vedic Cultural Centre in Markham; the Peel Arya Samaaj Mandir and Cultural Centre; the Shiva Mandir in Scarborough, the Seva4life Canada Inc.; the Humanitarian Mission of Port Mourant, Guyana; the Vedanta Academy in Bush Lot, Berbice, Guyana; Green Dupatta; the Children's Orphanage in Cl, Guyana; Shiva Mandir in Scarborough; Youths training camps, both in Guyana and Toronto; the Shiv Sewa Sangh Mandir in Scarborough; the Panwar Dance Academy of GTA; the Sangeet Vidyalaya Vedic Cultural and Educational Centre Inc.; the Maha Rudradev Mandir and Cultural Centre in Scarborough, The Guyana Festival, Toronto and many more.



Linden King is described as leadership personified. Over the last 48 years, he has made extraordinary contributions to the betterment of the community, distinguishing himself through a multitude of leadership roles. He is the President for Safe City Mississauga, Chair for the United Way Greater Toronto Black Community Advisory Council, Co-Chair for The Peel Region Police Black Community Advisory Group, Community and Stakeholder Liaison for The Toronto Caribbean Carnival, the past hair for The Liberty Silver Foundation and the past Vice Chair for The Congress of Black Women Mississauga Chapter Non-Profit Housing Inc.

King is also the recipient of a number of prestigious awards such as the 2015 Mississauga Citizen of the year; Gordon Shipp Memorial Award, 2015 Top 100 Black Canadian Role Models, TORONTO 2015 Pan Am Games -Torchbearer, 2016 Ontario Volunteer Service Awards, The Ontario Trillium Foundation, Halton-Peel Grant Review Team, 2016 Community Service Award - Trinidad and Tobago Association, 2019 Community Service Award – Save Max Real Estate Inc, 2019 Ontario Volunteer Service Awards – Mississauga Arts Council. Imran Ally Volunteerism & Community Service

Imran Ally is the official Imam and resident scholar (Shaykh) of the TARIC Islamic Centre where he continues in service dutifully since 2000. His charismatic delivery along with his ability to establish meaningful and honest connections when speaking to crowds, make him a sought after Imam to preside over many milestone occasions and community events. His role encompasses being a religious guide, educator, counsellor, arbitrator, mediator, marriage officer, events coordinator and much more.

Imran Ally continues to give back to Guyana through volunteering with the Canadian Support Group of the Central Islamic Organization of Guyana (CIOG). His professional appointments include: Peel Regional Police (third largest Police Service in Canada) - Chaplain, Humber River Hospital (first digital hospital in North America) – Chaplain, Kipling Acres (one of the City of Toronto's ten long term care homes) Chaplain, Ontario Ministry Services - Registered Clergy (Marriage Officer), Bereavement Authority of Ontario – Faith Advisory Committee Member, DEEN Support Services – Board Member, Canadian Multifaith Federation - Board Member, Canadian Police Chaplains Association – Member, Canadian Council of Imams, Association of Muslim Chaplains (USA) – International Observer Member, Chaplain for University of Toronto (Mississauga Campus).



Arts & Entertainment Distinction

This award is presented to artists, musicians and cultural leaders in recognition of artistic excellence, cultural leadership and contribution to the arts.



Jan Morgan is described as a *trumpeter extraordinaire* and in some quarters, he is fondly referred to as a musical genius and a musician's musician. This talented trumpeter has over the years been playing at numerous charitable events in the Guyanese community, which allows him to expand and showcase his melodic musical virtuosity on the trumpet.

Mr. Morgan has performed with several musical groups including the Jazz Crusaders, The Yorbua Singers and Sound Dimension, Triple Play, Surefire Band, New Generation, Traction, and Ossie Girley, among others. He also recorded with several internationally-renowned artistes including Calypso Rose and Anslem Douglas from Trinidad & Tobago, Red Plastic Bag, Rupee and Mighty Gryner from Barbados, Vincentians Ronnie McIntosh, Winston So So, and Nigel Lewis, reigning Grenadian Soca Monarch, King Ajamu, and several other artistes. He also recorded and performed with Kobotown who captured the 2018 Juno Award for Best World Music Album.

According to Mr. Morgan, he enjoys listening and playing all genres of music but by playing music from Guyana and the Caribbean he keeps our music alive, moreso "because we need musical growth, we need musical quality and we need more fusion of our music into the North American and European scene".





Sandra Brewster is a visual artist based in Toronto. She has been recognized for her communitybased practice that centres a Black presence located in Canada. Her work has been featured in solo exhibitions including the Art Gallery of Ontario, the Art Gallery of Guelph, Or Gallery in Vancouver, YYZ Artists' Outlet in Toronto, A Space Gallery in Toronto; and in group exhibitions including Mamuzic Gallery, Novi Sad, Serbia, Art Gallery of Nova Scotia, Arsenal Habana in Cuba, Dunlop Art Gallery in Regina, Saskatchewan, Lagos Photo Festival in Nigeria, Musée des beaux arts in Montreal, the Royal Ontario Museum, Art Gallery of Windsor, and Allegheny Art Galleries in Meadville, Pennsylvania.

Brewster's exhibition "Blur" received the Gattuso Prize for outstanding featured exhibition of CONTACT Photography Festival 2017. She is the 2018 recipient of the Artist Prize from Toronto Friends of the Visual Arts and is a 2018 Artist-in-Residence at the Art Gallery of Ontario. She was also recognised for her role in the production of the video "Changing seasons: From Guyana to Canada".



Andrea Douglas founded the Children & Youth Dance Theatre in 1992 and the Caribbean Dance Theatre in 1995 and served as their Artistic Director and Performer. While working with these two groups, she was a freelance dancer and choreographer and performed for the Miss Guyana Canada pageant, the Miss Jamaica pageant, the Miss Caribbean/Canada pageant, the Applause Institute's Cotillion Ball and the Edge Program.

The groups' repertoire includes modern dance, classical ballet, jazz, Afro Caribbean and hip-hop dance. This included educational excursions, cultural workshops, community performances, international tours among others.

Douglas received several media article coverages around the world, several awards of recognition and appreciation for her work, including the Harry Jerome Sward for Arts, award of recognition from the Applause Institute Finishing School, The Guyana Cultural Association of New York, The African Heritage Educators Network and The Caribbean Cultural Committee (Caribana).


